D Dresden Blades	Multi	1 1/4 Yard Total for all blades * See Note below
E Inner Border	Light	1/4 Yard
F Outer Border	Dark	3/4 Yard
G Binding	Dark	3/8 Yard
Backing	Multi	1 1/2 Yards
Batting		50" by 50"

*Note Dresden Blades- The sample is done with a scrappy fabrication.

Following are some yardages if using a specific number of fabrics.

- Using 2 fabrics – 1/2 yard of each fabric
- Using 5 fabrics – 1/4 yard of each fabric
- Using 10 fabrics- 1/4 yard of each fabric
(There will be extra fabric for 10 fabrics.)

Other Supplies

Dresden Splash Pattern by Anelie Belden

Thread to blend with fabrics for piecing

Freezer Paper

Water Soluble fabric glue

Basic sewing supplies -such as sewing machine, scissors,
seam ripper pins etc.

Starch, small paintbrush

Dresden Ruler by Fast2cut or template plastic

Fabric marking tools such as the blue

Rotary Cutting Tools: Ruler, Cutter & Board

Finger Pressing Tool

Scissors for Paper and Plastic

Mechanical Pencil

Please precut Block Background, Side Setting Triangles

Corner Triangles, and the strips needed for the blades.

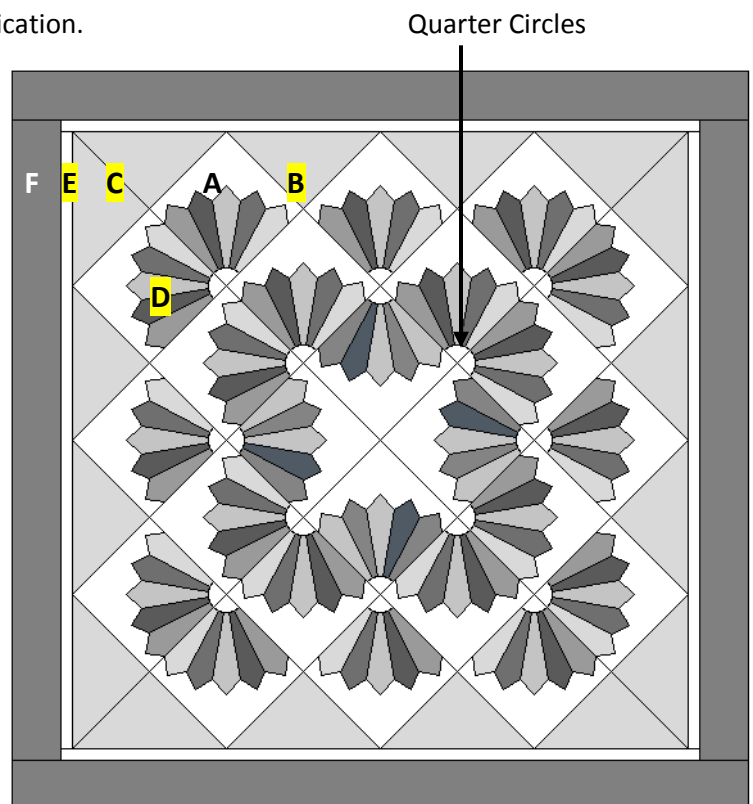
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Cutting Directions

Strips are cut across the width of the fabric.

Strips should be a minimum of 40" long

	Placement	Colors	First Strip Cut	Sub Cut
A	Block Background	Light	4 strips 6 1/2" wide	24 6 1/2" squares
	Quarter circles	Light		Use Template A/C to cut into 24 quarter circles
B	Side Setting Triangles	Medium	1 10" strip	Cut into 2 10" squares <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Cut twice diagonally
C	Corner Triangles	Medium	Use remaining from B	Cut into 2 10" squares <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Cut Once diagonally
D	Dresden Blades	Multi	Cut into 5 5 1/4" strips Total * See Note below	Use Template D to cut Into 120 blades Total * See Note below
E	Inner Border	Light	5 strips 1 1/2" wide	
F	Outer Border	Dark	5 strips 4 1/2" wide	
G	Binding	Dark	5 strips 2 1/4" wide	

*Note Dresden Blades- Following is cutting directions if using a specific number of fabrics.

- Using 2 fabrics – Cut 3 Strips of each fabric- Sub Cut into 60 blades per fabric
- Using 5 fabrics – Cut 1 Strip of each fabric- Sub Cut into 24 blades per fabric
- Using 10 fabrics- Cut 1 strip of each fabric- Sub Cut into 12 blades per fabric
(Note: with 10 fabrics there will be extra fabric. The width of 1/4 was required)
